Women's History Month

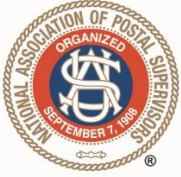

Her story underscores the critical need for fair, transparent evaluation systems. At USPS, our **Pay-for-Performance program** and **PES process** are designed to align expectations, measure results, and ensure compensation reflects actual performance. Ledbetter's legacy affirms the value of these systems in fostering equity, accountability, and recognition for the contributions we make each day.

SPAC - Your Support Matters

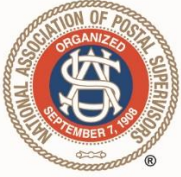
